Below are some sites of interest convenient to the Internet Archive, such as the arboretum in Golden Gate Park, Haight Ashbury, Japantown, etc. If you are in the City after dark, be sure to get off at Embarcadero BART to stroll along the Embarcadero for views of the Bay Bridge Bay Lights display.

Directions to Internet Archive: Take BART to Embarcadero station. Walk SW along Market Street to Fremont. Take the 38L towards Point Lobos and 48th Ave. and get off at the NW corner of Geary Blvd. and Park Presidio Blvd. (about 30 minutes). Turn around and head East one block to Funston and head North for nearly a block. The Internet Archive will be on your right at 300 Funston.

Last entry at 6pm, closes at 7pm.

Japantown: 1610 Geary Blvd. sfjapantown.org (38L goes right by)

Painted Ladies of Alamo Square: at Steiner & Fulton, about 7 blocks south of Geary & Divisadero if you're on the 38L. Famous row of Victorian houses juxtaposed against the SF skyline.

Sutro Baths & Lands End: at Golden Gate National Park – end of Point Lobos Ave. on the coast. Historic ruins as well as access to Lands End, a gorgeous, easy hike with stunning coastal views of the Golden Gate Bridge. <http://www.nps.gov/goga/planyourvisit/landsend.htm>. 38L to the end of the line (48th and Point Lobos)
