Our Starting Point: Immediate Family

- **Markus Marcel Jellinek**: father, born 1858 in Budapest, Hungary. Actor, writer and businessman. The Jellinek family owned and operated Budapest's public transportation system.
- **Rose Jacobson**, a.k.a. Marcella Lindh: mother, born circa 1866, possibly in Kalamazoo, MI, notable soprano.
- **Edna Jellinek**: sister, born circa 1900

Source #2: Thelma's Letters

- “Bunky was very, very fond of his paternal grandmother, **Johanna Fuchs Jellinek** who read four newspapers each day, each in a different language. When Bunky was (probably) a teenager, he spent vacations with grandmother at various spas”
- **Aunt Elsie** Jackson/Jacobson – first relative of Rose's mentioned



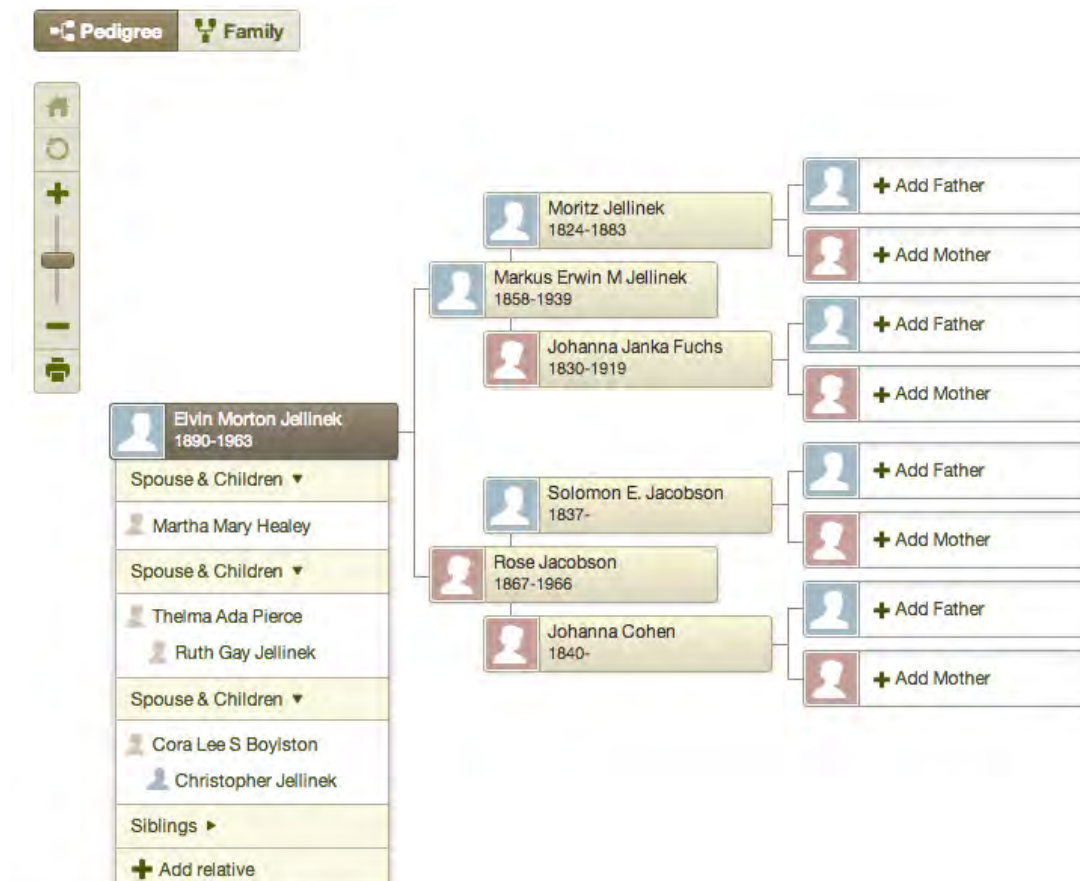
Jellinek's Grandmother, Mrs. Mór Jellinek (Julianna Fuchs)

Anecdotes from Thelma's Letters

- “When he was a boy, Bunky was given a small cannon. He loaded it with some explosive, took it to the garden, and set it off. Result: Neighbor's broken window. Bye-bye cannon.” (4/16/1988)
- “Youth was a happy and privileged time for Bunky. He had tutors, did not attend private school. He and his sister were too far apart in age (I think 11 years) to have many common interests though she recalls they played “opera”, wearing pots and pans as helmets. When they were adults, Bunky felt sorry for her – and there was reason enough” (4/16/1988)
- “From time to time, both before and after Marcel's death, Bunky liked to look at photos of his father and to talk about him. To the best of my recollection, there were no photos of his mother.”

2. Thelma Ada Pierce (b. 1911, NY): married in Keene, NH October 18, 1935 (Thelma’s letters + record of marriage on Ancestry). Divorced 1946; daughter Ruth born June 29, 1936.

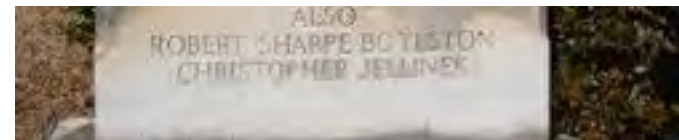
3. Cora Lee Boylston (b. 1910, SC): married 1947 in South Carolina until her death in 1951.

4. Martha Mary Healey – date of birth and marriage unknown. Believed to have been married to Jellinek while he was working in Canada.

Info from Death Report

- Died of pneumonia while in Geneva on 11/3/1950
- Maiden name = Summersett
- At least two children from previous marriage: Robert & Stephany
- First husband: Edward Boylston, lived in Baltimore, MD

Investigating Edna on Ancestry

- Full name: **Edna Eugenie (?) Jellinek Lindh Pariser**
(picture from 1921 passport)
- Trained as a musician
- Married **Robert Pariser**
(picture from 1919 passport)
around 1921, divorced
sometime after 1926
- Daughter **Marcella Krisztina Pariser** born in Budapest in
1926



Investigating Edna: Google News

- Baltimore Sun 1946-early 1950s: mentioned as director of the International Center at the Baltimore YWCA
- Performances as a musician and featured as authority on folk culture
- Wife of Mr. Joseph Cloud, married c. 1950
- Eventually moved with her mother to Detroit area



Mrs. Edna Jellinek, a member of the staff of the Y.W.C.A. International Center, is fluent in four languages besides English, and "can manage" in three others.

Finding the Jacobsons: the US Census

- Census records show family: Solomon & Johanna (parents), Gustave, Charles, & Jacob (brothers)
- Witness signature “G.S. Jacobson” = Gustave, Rose’s brother
- Helped Marcel in business, Founded Jacobson & Co., successful plastering & decorating company

The Children: Ruth & Christopher

- Ruth traveled abroad with Jellinek as a teen, but lived with her mother in NYC.
- Married a Charles Surry, had two sons. Lived her final years in Santa Barbara, CA
